

In addition to all club rules, the Extension Office requires all 4-H members do the following in order to show at the Loudoun County Fair.

1. All members must complete a record book for each project animal identified to show in the current year in order to show at the following year's fair. Identification can be through weigh-in, tattoo, or other means determined by the club. In the case of death of a project animal, records will need to be kept up to the death and the story should reflect what transpired. If the 4-Her does not show at the Fair, a project book must still be submitted in order to qualify the following year. Completed record books must be turned into the Extension Office by October 15th and receive a 75% minimum score (red ribbon).
2. All members must complete one fair qualifier prior to July 10th of the fair year. Some fair qualifiers are:
 - a. Officer Training – October
 - b. Ambassador Training/Trip to the Capital – late January/February
 - c. Presentation Day – February
 - d. Share The Fun – March
 - e. Day of Service – early May
 - f. 4-H Congress—June
 - g. 4-H Camp – camper or counselor – June
 - h. 4th of July Parade: Float building or planning and parade participation
 - i. Any others identified and approved by the Extension Office
3. Attend one of the mandatory fair cleanup dates in July.
4. Cloverbud members must complete the above requirements, with the exception of the project book.
